

Dear Mr. Greer:

It was a pleasure speaking with you regarding the possibility of being retained as the Attorney for the Town of homer. I would be honored to assist the Town.

The billing rate would be \$200 per hour which is my discounted municipal rate. Clerk of Court filing and recording fees and any other out of pocket expenses and costs shall be passed along and billed at the actual cost charged. There is no charge for long distance phone calls or standard postage. However, any extraordinary postage or shipping costs will be passed along for payment. There is no copy charge for standard copying but I do charge \$.10 per page for extraordinary copy services when required. Mileage is reimbursed at the rate of \$.55 per mile.

Invoices are sent out at the beginning of each month for the previous month's work, All invoices are due upon receipt and payment is due not later than thirty days after the sending of the invoice.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF HOMER, LOUISIANA, APPROVING THE TRANSFER OF AIRPORT ASSETS TO THE CLAIBORNE PARISH AIRPORT DISTRICT NO. 31.

WHEREAS, the Louisiana State Legislature has created the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31 through House Bill No. 651, as codified in Act No. 214 of the 2025 Regular Legislative Session; and

WHEREAS, the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31 is a political subdivision of the state of Louisiana, empowered to manage, operate, and develop airport facilities within its jurisdiction, including the ability to acquire, maintain, and improve airport infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Homer is the current owner of the airport and related assets, including land, facilities, and equipment used for the operation of the Homer Municipal Airport; and

WHEREAS, the transfer of these airport assets to the newly established Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31 is in the best interest of the residents of Homer, Claiborne Parish, and the broader region, to ensure the continued development and sustainability of airport operations; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of Homer has determined that the transfer of the airport assets to the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31 should be formalized through an official resolution and agreement between the Town of Homer and the Airport District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Homer, Louisiana, in regular session convened on the 14th day of July, 2025, as follows:

- 1. Transfer of Assets: The Town of Homer hereby authorizes the transfer of ownership of the Homer Municipal Airport and all related assets, including but not limited to land, buildings, equipment, and facilities, to the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31, in accordance with the provisions of Louisiana Act No. 214 (2025 Regular Legislative Session).
- 2. Execution of Transfer Agreement: The Mayor of Homer is hereby authorized and directed to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate the transfer of assets, including an official agreement between the Town of Homer and the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31, and any necessary legal instruments.
- 3. Effective Date: This transfer shall take effect upon the signing of the agreement by the authorized representatives of the Town of Homer and the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31, and shall be contingent upon all necessary approvals from the appropriate state and federal authorities, including but not limited to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).
- 4. Further Actions: The Town of Homer agrees to cooperate fully with the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31 in the transition of airport operations and assets, and shall provide any additional documentation or assistance as required by the District to ensure a smooth transfer of ownership and responsibilities.
- 5. Severability: If any provision of this resolution is held to be invalid or unenforceable, such provision shall be severed from the resolution and the remainder of the resolution shall remain in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Mayor of Homer, the members of the Town Council, the Claiborne Parish Airport District No. 31, and any other interested parties.


